

The New Natural Selection

The nuclear impasse stems from our delusion that territorial and ideological disputes qualify as issues for which the four billion year process of life can be sacrificed. The commercial-industrial impasse results from our delusion that consumer demands are reason enough to ruin any habitat, any community of life, even the very conditions from which life emerges and evolves on this planet. The sickness of the present situation will continue to escalate with ever more cruelty and suffering until we learn the fuller dimensions of our role within evolution's unfoldment. Oedipus could not move toward health until he discovered that he had unknowingly been violating his mother. We are only now realizing that we have been violating Mother Earth for centuries. The...
