

Mary Evelyn Tucker is a professor of religion at Bucknell University in Lewisburg, Pennsylvania, where she teaches courses in world religions, Asian religions, religion and ecology, and religion and nature writers. She received her Ph.D. from Columbia University in the history of religions, specializing in Confucianism in Japan. She has published Moral and Spiritual Cultivation in Japanese Neo-Confucianism (SUNY, 1989). She co-edited Worldviews and Ecology (Orbis, 1994), Buddhism and Ecology (Harvard, 1997), Confucianism and Ecology (Harvard, 1998), and Hinduism and Ecology (Harvard, 1999). She is currently co-editing with Tu Weiming two volumes on Confucian Spirituality which will probably be published in 2001 by Crossroad in the series on World Spirituality. She and her husband, John Grim, have directed a series of ten conferences on World Religions and Ecology at the Harvard University Center for the Study of World Religions from 1996-1998. They are the series editors for the ten volumes which are being published from the conferences by the Center and Harvard University Press. They are also editors of a book series on Ecology and Justice from Orbis Press. In addition, they are now coordinating an ongoing Forum on Religion and Ecology (FORE). Mary Evelyn has been a committee member of the Environmental Sabbath program at the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) since 1986 and is Vice President of the American Teilhard Association.
